

<u>BEHAVIOUR POLICY:</u> Each year at school we review, evaluate and remind ourselves of our behaviour policy. Sometimes we make small changes to help our children achieve good behaviour. Staff worked together on this earlier in the week and then the children have been taught about it again in a special assembly. We think our children have really good behaviour BUT sometimes it can slip and we can forget our school rules. This term is a chance to re-set and learn again. Our behaviour policy is underpinned by our gospel values so we have very high standards. It's important that we give our children lots of help and support to learn good behaviour just like we do with their academic learning. The policy will soon be ready for parents to review and evaluate on the website and we thank you for your continued support.

<u>DATLY MILE:</u> Starting next week, the children in Years 5 and 6 will be walking or jogging for a mile each day around a specially measured circuit of the surrounding streets near to the school building.
