**READING TOP TIP:** Our top tip this week is: 'Ask your child to summarise what they have read.' When you've finished reading, talk about what happened. Acting out the things that happened in the story or describing the big idea of a chapter is really fun and maximises learning. For example, 'can you remember all the things that happened on the bear hunt?' Or perhaps, try writing down the main events as a list to help you to remember the story.

<u>CELEBRATING POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR</u>: As a school this week, we have continued to remind ourselves about our behaviour policy and how we are expected to make a positive contribution towards the learning in our classrooms during lessons. We looked at our traffic light system in more detail and discussed what rewards are in place for pupils who display the expected standards of behaviour during lessons. We also recognised that, at times, some children may need some extra support with managing their own behaviour during lessons but our goal is always to finish the lesson with our names on the green light. Our younger children have a very similar system in their classrooms based on the sun, rain and clouds and the teachers adapted their discussions so that they were age appropriate and just as simple for the children to understand. Next week, we'll be looking in more detail at our 'Golden rules for the playground.'





The teachers are always on the look out for ways in which to encourage the children to produce their best and most worthy work of themselves. This is what we always ask of them.... 'Do your best!' Each time the teachers mark the children's books, they will look back at their most recent work to see if there has been an improvement with presentation. If there has, then the teacher will write **#proud** in the child's exercise book in recognition of producing work worthy of themselves and that they have made their teacher proud. Why not ask your child if they have made their teacher **#proud** this week!

The Year 6 class have been multiplying fractions this week and have been taught about the importance of showing their workings out during a novel graffiti maths lesson! **INDUSTRIAL ACTION:** You may be aware, from media coverage, that the National Education Union (NEU) has declared strike action, with the first day of action taking place on Wednesday, 1<sup>st</sup> February. The strike is happening because of a national dispute between the union and the government over teachers' pay and conditions, and not because of any issues at our school. Some of our teachers are members of the NEU and therefore it is most likely that they will be taking strike action on that day. Some of our staff belong to unions that are not currently taking action and will attend school as normal. Therefore, some classes will close on Wednesday, 1<sup>st</sup> February. We advise any working parents to give advance notice of this to their employers and a further letter will be sent out to parents next week.
