BOOK DEN DEVELOPMENTS?! 'What's going on with the book den?' 'Why have the teachers closed the book den?' 'We can't even use it at lunchtime?' 'I'm a free reader! Where will I get my new book from?' Just some of the questions the children have bombarded staff with yesterday. Keep a look out children for a grand new opening....!!

READING TOP TIP: Our top tip this week is: GET THE WHOLE FAMILY INVOLVED!! They say a change is as good as a rest so if mum and dad are usually the adult who hears your child read then why not encourage your child to read with other family members, such as grandparents, brothers and sisters, aunts and uncles. Children love to show off how well they have progressed to other members of the family!!



READING BOOKS / HOMEWORK / P.E. KITS: Please encourage your child to remember to bring their book bags in school each day. These bags should contain a reading book and any homework that has been set by the teacher. P.E. kits should also be brought in and left in school. Over the next couple of weeks, the teachers will be checking that the children are bringing their book bags into school, regularly submitting homework, reading regularly at home, changing their reading books and engaging with some of our online learning platforms. They have lots of house points to give out to those children who are showing responsibility for their own learning!





HERE TO HELP WITH THE COST OF LIVING: Are you on a prepayment meter for energy bills? Have you redeemed your energy vouchers from last October and November? Did you know that one in five households with pre-payment meters have not cashed in their energy vouchers issued to help pay bills. The main reason for people not cashing an energy voucher is because they have not received it yet. Although the deadline has passed, it is still possible for the voucher money to be claimed. A person who has not received their voucher or has not cashed it in time needs to contact their energy supplier, check that their contact details are correct, and ask for the voucher to be reissued to them.

<u>CURRICULUM ENRICHMENT:</u> As part of their geography topic this term about identifying human and physical geographical features, the Year 4 class will be heading out on a river cruise around Salford Quays on Thursday, 16th February. <u>CURRICULUM NEWS</u>: Another super busy week in the curriculum this week!! The Year 2 children have been studying the work of Yayoi Kusama during Art Day and they've created printed examples of pumpkins using a polypress!! The Year 6 class were out and about as they went into Manchester to visit the Civil Justice Centre! They participated in a Victorian trial re-enactment with one of our pupils on trial!! Luckily, the verdict was... 'not guilty!' Year 1 have been applying their scientific knowledge during Design Technology and they have investigated the most appropriate materials to use when making an umbrella or parasol. <u>SAFER INTERNET DAY:</u> We marked Safer Internet Day in school this week with age appropriate lessons about keeping ourselves and one another safe online. ONLINE SAFETY: As we're all aware, there are many benefits for our children accessing the world wide web! We are also very aware that some of our children have gone against advice and guidance regarding the use of social media platforms such as Tik Tok, Instagram, Snapchat and Whatsapp. As a school, we do not advocate our children having social media accounts or being members of 'group chats' because we believe that they are not emotionally mature enough to use them correctly. Therefore, we ask parents to closely monitor your child's use of their phone, their messaging and engagement on social platforms and messaging. Safeguarding is everyone's concern so let's work in partnership to ensure our children know how to keep themselves safe as well as how to conduct themselves appropriately on line.

ATTENTION YEAR 1, 2 AND 3 PARENTS: Do you know about one of our free online resources called Numbots? Our most recent assessments have shown that our younger children in Years 1, 2 and 3 will really benefit from practising basic addition and subtraction skills. Numbots is an online game and playing little and often will significantly improve your child's recall and understanding of number bonds and addition and subtraction facts. These are critical foundations in maths so we are excited about the impact that Numbots will have. To login, the children use the same username and password that they use for Mathletics and Times Tables Rock Stars and their username and password can be found at the front of their Reading Record book. There's nothing stopping our older children in the school from joining in too!



WORLD BOOK DAY - THURSDAY, 2ND MARCH: Our theme for this year is....'not all heroes wear capes!' We are challenging our children to come to school dressed as a <u>real person</u> in their lives who inspires them. Ideas include: parents, grandparents, a sports coach, dance teacher, a volunteer at their community centre OR a profession that inspires them: medics, police officers, fire-fighters, charity workers, barristers, judges, dentists, trades people, enviornmentalists. Get your thinking caps on everyone as it's only a month away. We know we always have a fantastic response and it's a day of great fun for the whole community. As always, we ask that parents don't spend <u>ANY</u> money for our World Book Day!


