

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

READING TOP TIP: Our top tip this week is... MAKE TIME TO READ! Research shows that reading with your child for as little as 10 minutes a day can significantly boost how well they do at school. Set aside a regular time every day to read with your child, whether it's for 10 minutes when they get in from school or reading a bedtime story together. Little and often works best!

The government's cost-of-living payments are available for those receiving certain benefits or tax credits. You don't need to apply for these - if you're eligible the money should go straight into your account. If you think you're due a payment but haven't received one, report a missing payment to the government. Be aware of scams! If you receive any emails, texts or phone calls asking you to fill in an application form or asking for your bank details to receive a cost-of-living payment, do not talk to them or send a reply. <u>LOCAL ELECTIONS</u>: From 4th May 2023, registered electors will need to show photo ID when voting at polling stations. You may already have a form of photo ID that is acceptable. You can use any of the following:



- Passport issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, a British Overseas Territory, an EEA state or a Commonwealth country
- Driving licence issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle
 of Man, or an EEA state(including a provisional driving licence)
- A Blue Badge
- Older Person's Bus Pass funded by the Government of the UK
- Disabled Person's Bus Pass funded by the Government of the UK
- Oyster 60+ Card funded by the Government of the UK
- Freedom Pass
- Identity card bearing the Proof of Age Standards Scheme hologram (a PASS card)


