<u>CHANGES TO OUR ATTENDANCE POLICY:</u> To bring us in line with other Manchester schools, any families who take holidays during term time will be issued with a fixed penalty notice of £60.00. Both parents will receive a fine for each child in school. This change in policy will be from September.

READING TOP TIP: Our top tip this week is: TAKE BREAKS WHILE READING. Your child doesn't have to read an entire book in one go! Any time spent sharing or talking about a book is beneficial, even if it's just a couple of minutes at a time. If they have to close the book early because it's time for tea, or they're just losing interest, that's okay. Reading can take a lot of mental energy and taking breaks gives children a chance to slowly build the mental stamina they need, so that soon they will be able to read for longer stretches of time.





HERE TO HELP WITH THE COST OF LIVING: Did you know that as many as one million people cut off their broadband in the last year as the cost-of-living crisis left them unable to afford internet access, according to new research from Citizens Advice. People on Universal Credit are among customers who should be eligible for discounted social tariffs to help them stay connected. The latest figures from Ofcom show 95% of the 4.3 million eligible households are missing out on saving £200 on broadband costs each year. That is £824 million of support going unclaimed!! Social tariffs are cheaper broadband and phone packages for people claiming Universal Credit, Pension Credit and some other benefits. Some providers call them 'essential' or 'basic' broadband. They're delivered in the same way as normal packages, just at a lower price. So if you think that you are eligible, just get in touch with your internet provider.

TRIP'LE A CHALLENGE: Since the start of term, we've been telling the children that the teachers are ever so busy planning end of year trips for them. Well the good news is that all of the trips have now been booked in!! Of course the children are really excited about this...BUT...we have also informed them that they will be invited to attend the trip if they are able to meet our challenge for good Attendance, a positive Attitude towards their behaviour and Achieving to the very best of their ability during their lessons. We know that our parents will support us with this and encourage their children to meet this challenge! For budgeting purposes, it is anticipated that each trip will average out at approximately £10 after a heavy subsidy from school fund.
