

Thank you to all parents, carers and pupils who have embraced the revised arrangements for drop off and collection at the start and end of the school day. We will continue to practise and work together this half term to ensure the arrangements are embedded in readiness for September. As a reminder, the school gates will open for drop off at 8:40 a.m. and close at 8:50 a.m. for all pupils. Any latecomers must report to the school office to have their child signed in. At home time, the gates will open at 3:15 p.m. for collection of all pupils.



<u>CORPUS CHRISTI</u>: This Sunday is the feast of Corpus Christi. On this day devout Christians gather together to honour the sacred body of Jesus Christ. The day is also known as Corpus Domini, which literally translates to 'body and blood of Christ.' In this Sunday's Gospel we will hear how Jesus is offering to nourish us. He offers us eternal life through the gift of himself which we receive in Holy Communion and He continues to nourish us through the Church today. With Jesus' love we will always be nourished. Just as we eat bread to nourish our bodies, Jesus (in Holy Communion) nourishes our souls - to help us to keep growing in goodness and love.
