<u>CHANGES TO OUR ATTENDANCE POLICY:</u> To bring us in line with other Manchester schools, any families who take holidays during term time will be issued with a fixed penalty notice of £60.00. Both parents will receive a fine for each child in school. This change in policy will be from September.



<u>READING TOP TIP:</u> Our top tip this week is: **SWAP A BOOK**. Encourage your children and their friends to swap books with each other - it'll give them a chance to read new stories, and get them all talking about what they're reading. Obviously, make sure that children have finished with their book first and ensure that the adults agree that it's okay to do a swap!!

HERE TO HELP WITH THE COST OF LIVING-HOUSING COSTS: If

you're a tenant, the Universal Credit housing costs element can help towards the cost of your rent and some service charges. If you're a homeowner, you can't get the housing costs element to help with mortgage payments. But you might be able to get help from the government to pay the interest on your mortgage, known as Support for Mortgage Interest (SMI). Also, Mrs Fox will be arranging daily phone calls home so that the children can tell their parents/carers about the fun time that they are having.

<u>CHANGE IS ON THE WAY!!</u>: Unfortunately Pay360, our online payment system, is being withdrawn by the company at the end of July. This means that we will have to move over to a new payment system before the end of term in order to be ready for September. More information about how to register will be sent out next week. Please keep an eye out and register as soon as possible so that you are ready for the start of the new school year.

PRICE INCREASE: From September, the price of a school meal will be £2.45 per day, £12.25 per week. The menus for September are attached. Please note that there is also a choice of sandwiches or jacket potatoes available each day. If you wish your child to move from packed lunch to school meals, or vice versa, please let the school office know as soon as possible.

<u>UNIVERSAL INFANT FREE SCHOOL MEALS:</u> As you are aware, children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are provided with a free school meal each day as part of the government's Universal Free School Meals initiative.

This means that children who are currently in the Nursery 2 class will no longer pay for meals when they move to the Reception class in September. Please can you make sure that any dinner money arrears are cleared before the end of term.

This also means that children who are currently in Year 2 will need to pay for their meals from September when they move into Year 3.

<u>FSM VOUCHERS</u>: The Council has approved funding for supermarket vouchers for children eligible for free school meals (FSM) for the Summer break to help with the financial pressures placed on many of our families at this time. This will be a one off payment of £55.00 issued to parents in the last week of term. This can be redeemed at a supermarket of your choice. Please contact the school office before the break if you have any problems accessing the voucher.

<u>DREADING THE 6 WEEK HOLIDAYS?!</u> The Summer holidays are fast approaching. MCRactive and Manchester City Council are offering thousands of FREE places for children eligible for benefits-related free school meals. Activities will range from Sport and Physical Activities, Arts and Crafts and much more. In addition to the activities, their booked place will include a FREE meal during the day.

You will need to sign up for an MCRactive Go account https://www.mcractive.com/ (sign in) to book free Summer Holiday activities. Once signed up, log into your account - Find Activities - Search by Category 'MCR Holiday Activity' - Use code: 64894 to book free eligible activities. You can also visit https://loadstodo.co.uk/ to view additional FREE holiday activities and other opportunities taking place across the city.

Please note that the system will only show sessions 6 weeks in advance, so you may need to log back in at a later date to make further bookings.

*Please only book your child onto a holiday camp if they will be attending. Spaces at each camp are limited. If you book a space and your child can no longer attend, please cancel your space as far in advance as possible, to allow the opportunity for another child to take their space at the activity and free meal.


