#### **TRANSITION**

Most children had the opportunity to meet their new teachers for September and this will help them to get excited about 'moving on up'. Early on in September, parents will be invited into school to meet and greet your new teachers and you'll have the chance to find out exactly what will be happening for your child. Please look out for a letter from me via email just before the term starts with some further updates and relevant information for the start of the year.

#### CHANGES TO FINANCIAL MATTERS

<u>SCHOOL GATEWAY:</u> As you are aware, Pay360, our online payment system, is being withdrawn by the company. This means that we are moving over to School Gateway and ask that you register before the end of term in order to be ready for September. More information has already been sent out this week so please check your emails and register as soon as possible so that you are ready for the start of the new school year.

It probably won't come as a surprise to you that unfortunately, we too, are having to raise our charges for certain services despite still subsidising them.

Breakfast club: this will increase to £15.00 a week.

School meals: these will increase to £2.45 per day, £12.25 per week.

After school club: NO CHARGE, completely funded by school so please make the most of this.

<u>UNIVERSAL INFANT FREE SCHOOL MEALS:</u> As you are aware, children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are provided with a free school meal each day as part of the government's Universal Free School Meals initiative.

This means that children who are currently in the Nursery 2 class will no longer pay for meals when they move to the Reception class in September. Please can you make sure that any dinner money arrears are cleared before the end of term.

This also means that children who are currently in Year 2 will need to pay for their meals from September when they move into Year 3.



FSM VOUCHERS: The Council has approved funding for supermarket vouchers for children eligible for free school meals (FSM) for the Summer break to help with the financial pressures placed on many of our families at this time. This is a one off payment of £55.00 issued to parents this week. This can be redeemed at a supermarket of your choice. Please contact the school office before the break if you have any problems accessing the voucher.

<u>DREADING THE 6 WEEK HOLIDAYS?!</u> The Summer holidays are fast approaching. MCRactive and Manchester City Council are offering thousands of FREE places for children eligible for benefits-related free school meals. Activities will range from Sport and Physical Activities, Arts and Crafts and much more. In addition to the activities, their booked place will include a FREE meal during the day.

Once signed up, log into your account - <a href="find-Activities">Find Activities</a> - Search by Category 'MCR Holiday Activity' - Use code: 64894 to book free eligible activities. You can also visit <a href="https://loadstodo.co.uk/">https://loadstodo.co.uk/</a> to view additional FREE holiday activities and other opportunities taking place across the city.

Please note that the system will only show sessions 6 weeks in advance, so you may need to log back in at a later date to make further bookings.

\*Please only book your child onto a holiday camp if they will be attending. Spaces at each camp are limited. If you book a space and your child can no longer attend, please cancel your space as far in advance as possible, to allow the opportunity for another child to take their space at the activity and free meal.

<u>ATTENTION YEAR 5 PARENTS:</u> Parents of children in our current Y5 class, the window for Y7 applications is now open.
