<u>READING TOP TIP</u>: Our top tip this week is: Ask your child to **make predictions** about what they are about to read. If it is a book, look at the front cover—or the last chapter—and talk about what might happen next. Look for clues in the book and be a reading detective! For example, 'can you see the bear on the front cover? Where do you think he will go?'

INTRODUCING NUMBOTS!: Do you know about one of our free online learning platforms called Numbots? It's great for children in Reception, Year 1, Year 2 and Year 3. Numbots is an online game and playing little and often will significantly improve your child's recall and understanding of number bonds and addition and subtraction facts. These are critical foundations in maths so we are excited about the impact that Numbots will have. The children have been shown how to login and have brought home a username label inside their reading record. This is the same username and password that they use for Mathletics and Times Tables Rock Stars. There's nothing stopping our older children in the school from joining in too!

<u>PARENTS' EVENING</u>: Further to the 'Meet the Teacher' meetings a couple of weeks ago, parents will have the opportunity to make an individual appointment with their child's class teacher on <u>Tuesday</u>, 17th October. The teachers will be able to report on how well your child has settled in this academic year and discuss individual targets to support your child's progress. A five minute appointment between 3:30-5:15 p.m. can be made. Staff will be out on the playground after school each day next week so that parents can make an appointment that is most convenient for them. Alternatively, make a phone call to the office and the staff will be able to slot you in for a suitable time to suit you.
