<u>BOOK DEN:</u> Our children have been delighted to be back in our book den this term with our reading leaders keeping a keen and watchful eye to ensure we're all looking after this beautiful space so that we can all enjoy our reading for pleasure. Our children really love reading the vast array of picture books we have on offer because the illustrations and stories are of fantastic quality. These books help children to practice their reading skills and gives them an opportunity to use a variety of voices for characters.





<u>CURRICULUM NEWS</u>: Even though it's been assessment week in school this week, it hasn't stopped our children enjoying all of the usual lessons! Children in Reception are doing really well on learning how to be independent learners inside and out of the classroom - they've been painting, modelling with clay, chalk drawing, teaching each other phonics as well as role playing as police officers! Year 5 have been creating a collage linking to their Geography topic on Antartic. Year 4 were busy composing AND performing on their glockenspiels.

<u>ON-LINE SAFETY:</u> Our digital leaders have been busy this week, carrying out surveys to see what our children get up to whilst online. Learning has included the dangers of impersonation and fraud as well as the power of influencers. The Year 4 class also participated in some online training about how to lead assemblies on current affairs. They joined other children from across the country and are going to have a go at putting an assembly together for our younger pupils.
