



BRIGHTEN UP FOR CAFOD: As a school community, we are always proud to support the magnificent work that CAFOD do. Around the world, one in three people have gone hungry in the last year. Harvest Fast Day this year is on Friday, 7th October and CAFOD have invited us to participate by fundraising for their World Food Crisis appeal and supporting our global family. We are asking the children to come into school in their brightest and most colourful clothing on that day and are asking for donations of 50p per pupil or £1 per family. Thank you in advance for your generous support.

<u>AVAILABLE PLACES</u>: We currently have spaces in most of our classes. Some families think that they aren't eligible to come to our school. We often hear, 'We can't come to your school because we aren't Catholic.' This isn't actually true. Baptised children are given priority when we have spaces but all families and children are welcome at our school. Please spread the word - your family and friends are very welcome!

<u>NURSERY PLACES</u>: We will shortly be arranging nursery admissions for January 2023. If your child is born between 01.09.2019 - 31.12.2019, please contact the school office as soon as possible to ensure we have your child's details.

READING TOP TIP: Our top tip this week is: Ask your child to make predictions about what they are about to read. If it is a book, look at the front cover—or the last chapter—and talk about what might happen next. Look for clues in the book and be a reading detective! For example, 'can you see the bear on the front cover? Where do you think he will go?'





<u>COMMUNICATION</u>: For those parents who have yet to complete the contact update forms form, please return it to school as soon as possible. Spare forms are available from the school office. Whilst our Admin Team process all of the forms, the weekly newsletter will continue to go home as a hard copy with each child on a Friday afternoon. <u>SCHOOL PHOTOGRAPHS:</u> Your child will have received their school photograph last week. On this form will be all the details on how to order and pay online. There is no way to order through school any longer. Orders should be placed online by 9th October for free delivery to school. Orders placed after this date will incur a delivery charge and will be sent directly to your home.





<u>school Meals</u>: The price of a school meal is £2.35 per day / £11.75 per week. Please make every effort to pay a week in advance through Pay360 (formally SIMSPay). Dinner money should not be more than 2 weeks in arrears. If you are struggling to pay, please contact the school office to discuss the matter. Please remember to inform the admin staff if you wish to make any changes to your child's meals arrangements. Two weeks' notice should be given if they are changing from school meals to bringing their own packed lunch.

<u>GIRLS' FOOTBALL TEAM:</u> Well done to our fantastic Year 5 and 6 Girls' Football Team who participated in a tournament at MCA on Monday evening. <u>ATTENTION YEAR 6 PARENTS:</u> It is now time to apply for your child's Year 7 place at high school. Go to Manchester.gov.uk/admissions to apply. The deadline for secondary school applications is **Monday**, 31st October and the message is... 'Don't leave it too late!' If you need help, please get in touch with your child's class teacher and we can support you.





<u>PARENTS' EVENING:</u> Further to the 'Meet the Teacher' meetings a couple of weeks ago, parents will have the opportunity to make an individual appointment with their child's class teacher on <u>Wednesday</u>, 12th <u>October</u>. The teachers will be able to report on how well your child has settled in this academic year and discuss individual targets to support your child's progress. A five minute appointment between 3:30-6:30 p.m. can be made and the teachers will be out on the playground after school each day next week so that parents can make an appointment that is most convenient for them. Alternatively, make a phone call to the office and the staff will be able to slot you in for a suitable time to suit you.

YEAR 6 CLASSICAL TOUR OF MANCHESTER: The children in Year 6 will be going on a 'Classical Tour of Manchester' on Wednesday, 12th October. 
