

<u>CURRICULUM NEWS</u>: It's been another very busy week across the school with so many exciting lessons in lots of different subjects! The Year 5 children have made great progress with music focussing on using both hands whilst playing the tin whistle. <u>GIRLS' FOOTBALL</u>: The Year 5 and 6 girls' football team represented St. Edmund's so well on Monday evening. They attended a tournament at MCA and competed against 5 other schools from the local area. Mr Reidy was so proud of how the girls showed great enthusiasm and sportsmanship both during and after each game. The team won 4 games and drew 1. Fantastic girls... well done!!

<u>SCARLET FEVER</u>: Scarlet fever is on the rise again! The first signs of scarlet fever can be flu-like symptoms, including a high temperature, a sore throat and swollen neck glands (a large lump on the side of your neck). A rash appears 12 to 48 hours later. It looks looks like small, raised bumps and starts on the chest and tummy, then spreads. It is highly contagious and is spread by close contact with someone carrying the bacteria. It takes around 2 to 5 days to develop symptoms after exposure to these bacteria. If you think you or your child has scarlet fever, you should consult your GP.
