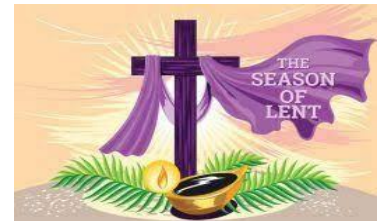
Our Statement to live by is:

READING TOP TIP: Our top tip this week is: **EXPLORE DIFFERENT READING MATERIALS.** When we think of reading, most of us immediately think of stories, especially story books, but there are many other different types of reading materials that children can use to practice their reading skills. As well as fiction, there is a whole world of comics, magazines, poetry, play scripts, newspapers, ebooks, audio books and non-fiction books for your child to discover and enjoy the love of reading.

CURRICULUM NEWS: Although most classes were affected by the strike days, the children have been really busy working on the curriculum on the days that they have been in school. To highlight just a few examples...The Year 2 children have been looking at artwork based on the Great Fire of London and have used different grade pencils to sketch houses during the Stuart period. The Year 1 class looked at features of a plant during their Science lesson. They looked at the similarities and differences between 2 bedding plants and also planted some sunflower seeds.

ATTENTION YEAR 4 PARENTS: At the start of June, the children in Year 4 will be screened to see how many of the multiplication facts up to 12 X 12 that they know. For a good few years, the school has subscribed to a fantastic resource called Times Tables Rock Stars or TTRS for short! This brilliant app is a fun, engaging and free way to help your child become a 'Rock Hero' and really help them to rapidly recall their multiplication facts. Ask your child how they log on... they should know their username and password off by heart by now! If not, they can find it at the front of their Reading Record (it's the same password as Athletics). With 10-15 minutes practise each evening, you'll be amazed at what progress the children really do make. Children in other year groups can access the app too soooooo get rockin'!!
