Research shows that 20 minutes reading each day will greatly enhance a child's progress.

Therefore, parents will have the opportunity to attend a meeting on **Tuesday, 12<sup>th</sup> September** at either 3:30 p.m, 4:15 p.m or 5:00 p.m. These meetings are really important as it gives the teachers the opportunity to communicate essential information as well as systems and routines within each individual class. There will be a further Parents' Evening on **Tuesday, 17<sup>th</sup> October 2023** when parents can book an individual appointment with the teacher to discuss how your child has settled in so far. **BREAKFAST CLUB:** We are delighted to continue with our offer to support working parents again this year. Our daily Breakfast Club will be available from 8:00 a.m. until 8:40 a.m. to enable working parents that little bit extra time to get to work on time. Any parents that wish to register, please come to the school office to make arrangements.

**AFTER SCHOOL SPORTS:** We are thrilled to be working with the coaches from Sports First Coaching again this year in order to provide the children with some high-quality P.E. provision in addition to the P.E. lessons taught during curriculum time. As was the case last year, we are able to offer the provision to our Key Stage 1 pupils as well as our Key Stage 2 pupils. The sessions will start during the week commencing **Monday, 18<sup>th</sup> September.**

**YEAR 4 SWIMMING:** Swimming lessons for Year 4 children will now take place on a Monday morning starting on **Monday, 11<sup>th</sup> September**. This is an important aspect of the National Curriculum and one in which Year 4 children must take part except for exceptional medical reasons. The children will be leaving school at 9:05 a.m. prompt in order to arrive at the swimming baths on time. Any parents who have not returned their form of consent will need to send this into school on Monday morning.



**SACRAMENTAL PROGRAMME:** Attention Year 3 parents!! Please look out for a further letter via email from Mrs Clinton next week. This is an important letter as it will inform you of all of the dates that you will need to be aware of as the children begin their Sacramental Programme this year. **SCHOOL PHOTOGRAPHER:** The school photographer will be in school this **Wednesday, 13<sup>th</sup> September** to take individual/family photographs. As usual, prints will be sent home in the coming weeks if parents wish to purchase a copy/copies.
