**Our Statement to live by next week is:
'I TRY TO FORGIVE PEOPLE WHEN THEY HURT ME.'**



SHOW KINDNESS: This Sunday is the last in the Church's year. It is the day we celebrate the feast of Christ the King. In the Gospel, Jesus (using the language and imagery of his time) describes what will happen when he comes again at the end of time. Like a shepherd who calls his sheep to follow him, Jesus invites people to be with him forever. The only requirement is that we should have loved our neighbour: that is, we should have looked after our neighbour in need.

This Sunday's Gospel reminds us that Jesus is present in all people, especially in the sick, anyone in need, and also he is present in you and in me. What we do for others, we do for Jesus - even small, everyday acts of kindness are most valuable in God's eyes.

"How marvellous it would be if, at the end of the day, each one of us could say: 'Today I have performed an act of charity towards others!'" (Pope Francis)

READING TOP TIP: This week's reading top tip is: '**VIDEO YOUR CHILD READING AND PLAY IT BACK TO THEM!**' This is a really good way to ensure that your child improves with skills like intonation and expression. Perhaps choose just one page from their reading book where an exclamation mark, question mark and/or speech mark is used by the author. Ask them to practise how the pitch of their voice changes to reflect the specific punctuation used on the page. Then, record your child on a device and play it back to them to see where improvements can be made. Try it... it's really fun and children just love watching themselves read aloud! Watch out for some of the teachers modelling these skills throughout Advent with some of their own favourite Christmas stories!!

ONLINE-SAFETY TOP TIP: Our top tip this week is: **BE AWARE OF AGE RESTRICTIONS.** Many popular sites (YouTube, Instagram, etc.) have age restrictions, and these are in place for a reason: to keep young people safe. Online services are not allowed to collect or store children's personal information if they are under the age of 13. Data protection laws also say that only children aged 13 and over can sign up to online services without parental permission. Following the age restrictions sets a good example for your child.

Don't allow your child to sign up for sites if they're underage or not ready. When they are old enough to register, make sure your child sets their online accounts to private to limit access to people they know well.

EYFS STAY AND PLAY: The EYFS pupils and staff loved welcoming parents/carers into school on Thursday morning for a session all around dental hygiene. The next stay and play will be on **Thursday, 14th December** and the session will be around activities that you can do with your child associated to the Christmas story.
