**<u>DINNER MONEY</u>**: Parents, please note that there will be an increase of 10p per day to school meals in September. Therefore, meals will cost £2.55 a day, £12.75 a week.

Children who are moving into our Reception class will now receive free school meals until the end of Year 2. This is known as 'universal free school meals'.

Children who are moving into Year 3 will either have to start paying for school dinners or bring in a packed lunch.

For older children, these could be crossword puzzles, word searches or word hunts. Have you ever played 'Wordle' online? ....it's brilliant!! For younger children, focus on playing with letters and sounds. You can use Play-Doh or alphabet magnets. All of these activities build your child's vocabulary and understanding of how words work. This will help them understand words when reading books, making reading easier and more enjoyable!
