



Our Statement to live by next week is: 'WE ARE ALL SPECIAL.'

We've hit the ground running this week and we've already got a busy term ahead so please take 10-15 minutes to read and digest the following notices.



BREAKFAST CLUB: We are delighted to continue with our offer to support working parents again this year. Our daily Breakfast Club will be available from 8:00 a.m. until 8:40 a.m. to enable working parents that little bit extra time to get to work on time. Any parents that wish to register, please come to the school office to make arrangements for payment.

<u>AFTER SCHOOL SPORTS:</u> We are thrilled to be working with the coaches from Sports First Coaching again this year in order to provide the children with some high-quality P.E. provision in addition to the P.E. lessons taught during curriculum time. Unfortunately, we only have capacity to offer the provision to 30 children per session and parents/guardians need to register before Monday. Please look in your emails for a letter which was sent out yesterday. The sessions will start next week on Monday, 9<sup>th</sup> September.

- Pupils in Years 2 and 3 on a Monday afternoon from 3:15-4.15 p.m.
- Pupils in Years 4, 5 and 6 on a Tuesday afternoon from 3:15-4:15 p.m.

Children who miss more than 2 consecutive sessions without giving a reason to the club leaders, will lose their place to a child on the waiting list. Parents who collect their child late on more than 2 occasions will also lose their child's place. This may



sound harsh but the staff are only on duty until 4.15 p.m. Thank you in advance for your co-operation and understanding. Staff will be seeking the views of the children so they get to learn and play new sports games – it's going to be great fun!



<u>YEAR 4 SWIMMING:</u> Swimming lessons for Year 4 children will start this Monday, 9<sup>th</sup> September. This is an important aspect of the National Curriculum and one in which Year 4 children must take part except for exceptional medical reasons. The children will be leaving school at 9:00 a.m. prompt in order to arrive at the swimming baths on time. Please be patient and wait your turn as the staff will be working methodically to make sure no-one gets missed.



<u>MEET THE TEACHER:</u> The teachers are really looking forward to meeting the parents/guardians of the pupils in their respective classes. Therefore, parents will have the opportunity to attend a meeting on <u>Wednesday</u>, 18<sup>th</sup> <u>September</u> at either 3:15 p.m, 4:00 p.m or 5:00 p.m. These meetings are really important as it gives the teachers the opportunity to communicate essential information as well as systems and routines within each individual class.





<u>SACRAMENTAL PROGRAMME</u>: Attention Year 3 parents!! Please look out for a further letter via email from Mrs Clinton next week. This is an important letter as it will inform you of all of the dates that you will need to be aware of as the children begin their Sacramental Programme this year. Please make a note of all of the celebration Masses as well as all of the parents' meetings prior to each celebration. It is essential that parents attend all of these meetings in order for the children to be ready and prepared to receive each sacrament.

<u>Monday</u>, <u>23<sup>rd</sup> September</u> - Parents/Guardians' and pupil meeting to prepare for the Rite of Presentation. (3:30 p.m. or 5:00 p.m.)

Sunday 6th October - Rite of Presentation Mass at St. Patrick's Church (9:15 a.m.)

<u>ST. MATTHEW'S OPEN EVENING:</u> Calling all Year 5 & 6 pupils and parents. St. Matthew's invite you to an open evening on <u>Thursday</u>, <u>3<sup>rd</sup> October</u> between 4:30 p.m. - 6:30 p.m. This event promise to be really informative and useful which will help you and your child as they either transition to high school or choose their high school.



<u>ATTENDANCE MATTERS</u>: It will be a surprise if parents/guardians are unaware of the new rules for attendance as it has been well communicated on news channels throughout the summer. From now on, schools will be considering fining parents if a child has 5 days of unauthorised absence. The fine will start at £80 per child and will be issued to each parent. The fine will increase to £160 if not paid in 21 days. Mrs Clinton will be sending out a letter outlining the school's expectations around attendance so that all parents/guardians are fully informed.



READING TOP TIP: Our top tip this week is...ESTABLISH A READING ROUTINE:- Every child in the school will be bringing home their new reading books and reading record books this week and next. Now that the holidays are over, encourage your child to make time to read regularly at some time during the evening. Research shows that 20 minutes reading each day will greatly enhance a child's progress.

<u>THE SEASON OF CREATION</u>: The season of creation is an annual international ecumenical initiative. It started on  $1^{st}$  September, the day of Prayer for Creation, and ends on  $4^{th}$  October, the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi the patron saint of ecology. This year's theme is, 'To hope and act with creation'. Our children will learn more about what we can do to look after our common home in the run up to our CAFOD Harvest Fast day in October.
