

ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY MATTER:



We didn't have the best start to the year. Here is a reminder of how we judge our attendance:

- 97%+ is green and good to go and this will be rewarded
- <97% but >93% is amber which means we need to improve
- <93% is red and not the result we want!
