

<u>AUTHORISED ABSENCES FOR ILLNESS:</u> In line with our attendance policy, once a child reaches 5 days of sickness absence (where medical evidence hasn't been provided), medical evidence is then required for absences to be authorised. Mrs Clinton will look at a child's registration and attendance over time to make a decision about a child's sickness absence.

<u>PUNCTUALITY:</u> A reminder to parents/carers that we all understand that occasionally, we run late and are behind. However, if children are persistently late for lessons after our registration closes, this will be marked as an authorised absence for that session.

<u>YEAR 4 TRIP TO EUREKA:</u> To support them with their Science curriculum, our children will be going to the fantastic Eureka! This is on Wednesday, 27^{th} November but donations need to be received by Wednesday, 20^{th} November if the trip is to go ahead. Please make your donation of £10.00 by this date.
