Our statement to live by next week is: 'In Lent, we prepare for Easter.'



<u>FORGIVENESS</u>: Forgiveness is the lifeblood of any family or community. In this Sunday's Gospel the younger son insults his father; his inheritance is all he thinks about. To make matters worse, his reason for returning is not love or consideration for his father, but simply his own desperate hunger. The father doesn't even question his son's motives. He welcomes his son back with the open heart and the open arms of forgiveness. The message for us is that, whatever we may have done wrong, if we are truly sorry, we can still count on the loving forgiveness of God, who is our Father, and on the freedom that his forgiveness brings. Enjoy exploring this Sunday's Gospel and this week's word, which is FORGIVENESS.




SACRAMENTAL PROGRAMME:

EMMAUS MULTI-ACADEMY TRUST: Next Tuesday, 1st April, our school will become an Academy - 'St. Edmund's Roman Catholic Voluntary Academy' and we look forward to working more closely with other local Catholic schools who are also joining the Trust. It's very likely that children and parents will not notice any changes and our close relationship with St. Patrick's will continue. We would like to thank Mrs Gavigan, our School Business Manager who has played a significant role in ensuring that this transition has been as smooth as possible.



<u>GOVERNANCE</u>: One change is to the governance of the school and the governing 'body' becomes a 'Local Governing Board'. We lose our Local Authority governor, Mr K. Cope and we would like to thank Mr Cope for his many years of dedicated service. The governing board has to reconstitute which means the governors have to be re-elected or reappointed because their terms of office automatically come to an end on 31st March. This means the term of office for our parent governors, Mr J. Mensey and Mr O. Dawodu also must come to an end. Thank you to these two parents for their service to the governance of our schools and being fantastic representatives for parents. We now need to re-elect. We've been instructed by the diocese that we are to have 1 parent from St. Edmund's on the board and 1 parent from St. Patrick's on the board. This ensures that both communities have full representation. If you feel that this could be a role for you, it is most rewarding and you'll certainly be making a difference.
